## **III. Chair Address**

### 1. Executive Vice President – Dylan Balcom

1. The main thing that I have been working on is appointing my directors, getting them all onboarded, helping them get their jobs started so that they can thrive. The biggest undertaking has been working with my directors on engagement. They have an activity coming up later that they will be leading and some other things, including the holiday party, so you should all get excited. We will be announcing it all next week, what the plans are for that.
2. Also, an update, I had previously mentioned that we would be doing Senate at the State House this semester, unfortunately they are renovating the State House, internally, so they quite literally there is no space for us to be in. We were invited to be one of the first groups actually to be in the fully renovated State House, or Senate Chambers there, so that will be pretty cool. So I will announce once we have finalized the new date for January, what that will be. Keep it on your radar. With that, I yield.

## **IV. Executive Addresses**

### 1. President – Nathan Hostert

1. Hello everyone, I hope that you all had a great weekend and are excited for Thanksgiving break. Really quickly, I want to preemptively apologize because my update might be a little bit longer today than it normally is.
2. First off, I want to start off by thanking you all. You all have been the most passionate, supportive, and action-oriented Senate that I have ever seen. As I met many of you over the past few months, I have been so inspired by the hope and dedication that you bring to SGA and I am incredibly excited to see the future of this association is so bright and I know that so many of you will go on to be amazing leaders, not only in this organization, but also in your lives, post-graduation.
3. It is with a heavy heart that I say that I am officially stepping down as Student Body President. This decision is motivated by a number of personal reasons which I won't delve into here, but which I believe make

this the best route forward. I know that if I stayed in this role any longer, I would not be able to perform my duties to the best of my ability. This has been one of the most difficult decisions that I have ever had to make, I am doing so for what I believe is best for both my well-being and also for this association.

4. While I leave this position with a heavy heart, I could not be more proud of the progress that we have made in just six short months! In half a year, we got Charlie Cards and Zipcar discounts for 3000 first-year students, we launched a program where students can get free meal swipes if they cannot afford them, we got students the ability to order safe sex supplies directly to their on-campus mailboxes, we expanded Title IX training to hundreds of first-year students with the Sexual Assault Response Coalition, we collected thousands of donated items for students affected by the Hemingway fire, and we overhauled the gender-inclusive housing process.
5. What I am most proud of though, are the incredible people in this association. Not only am I proud of the work that you all, as Senators, are doing, not only in SGA, but also in organizations that you represent, but I am also proud of SGA's fantastic leadership team. Each one of them is spearheading projects that is going to make all of our lives better as students. They have formed spectacular committees and boards, with outstanding members, many of whom are in this room, who are taking on projects on their own and thinking critically about how we can make this association better.
6. As I step away from this position, know that I am not disappearing. I will still be working on different advocacy projects to make this university better. I will still do whatever I can to support you all. I may not be at Senate as frequently, but that does not mean that I am unavailable. My email address is still the same, and I would love to meet with any of you if you need advice, or would just like to grab coffee, or connect.
7. I have spoken with Dylan, a lot, about all of this and I know that he is fully prepared to take on the position of Student Body President. When I ran with him on the Your Northeastern Ticket to be Student Body President and Vice President, we set a long list of priorities for how we would like to see, how we would like to make Northeastern a better place for all students and I am so proud to say that so many of those we have already accomplished, but I know that Dylan is dedicated to continue this fight and to make Northeastern an even better place than it is right now and to

accomplish so many more of those goals. I am so excited to see the great things that he is going to do and you all are going to do next semester.

9. Please, please, please, believe in yourself, and always try to make the world around you a little better.
10. So with that, I just want to thank you all for everything. And with that, I yield.
2. EVP Dylan Balcom: Thank you again for everything that you have done for this association and for this school. It doesn't go unappreciated.
3. Comptroller – Max W-G [Note: he was unable to attend, so EVP Balcom gave the following update on his behalf]

4. Vice President for Academic Affairs – Chris Brown
  1. First of all I wanted to thank Nathan for his amazing service. He has not only inspired me, but many others in this very room.   5. Block party is just around the corner, it is actually next Friday. You will be seeing more marketing material and I am also sending out like a volunteer sheet if you guys can sign up for that. If you want to volunteer and didn't have it, I will send out a bit.ly soon.
  6. Another thing is that I finally appointed my AVPs. I am sorry, but shout out to Casey Buttke and Jenna Malaeb, it was a really, really hard decision, but I am confident for the rest of the semester and going into the next

semester with them. Everyone was really great candidates. It was really hard, but I am sure that everyone is going to do great and I am super excited for them too.

7. Another thing is, last Wednesday I had this really cool opportunity to attend the Athletics Fan Committee. It is really new, and basically it goes with all of the Alumni and students and faculty who are interested in Athletics and we basically get to give our feedback on how they are doing.
